

Voice your opinion. Know that you have a voice through the AUD Student Government Association (SGA). You can talk with any officer regarding advice, concerns, complaints, issues, ideas, or clarifications. See page 14 for more information.

Make it a point to attend the General Student Forum that takes place during the Spring semester, and be an active participant of the AUD student body.

Plan your career. Schedule an appointment with the Career Services Office, sometime during your first year at AUD. The Career Services staff is always available to help you build your CV, identify and find internships and part-time jobs, offer interview techniques and presentation skills workshops, and assist in the job search process upon graduation.



STUDENT RIGHTS

Right to file a complaint. In an effort to continuously improve communication within the AUD community, the university has developed an online 'Student Complaint System'. The application http://complaints.aud.edu is accessible through the AUD website under the My AUD Portal section. The Student Complaint System is focused on providing feedback to problems/issues raised by AUD students.

Right to appeal your grade. You can appeal a grade; just make sure that you have evidence and proof as to why the grade should be other than what you were given. The Appeal Process is fully described in both the Student Handbook and the AUD Undergraduate Catalog.



PERSONAL LIFE

AUD offers one-on-one personal counseling services, if you are going through personal problems or if you are facing challenges which affect your personal growth, emotional well-being and success in the university. PERSONAL COUNSELING

When faced with new challenges, it is not uncommon for students to seek extra support to help them achieve academic success.

The Personal Counselor is a trained professional who is committed to helping students identify, understand, and develop skills to increase their self-awareness and resolve their personal concerns.



COUNCELING SERVICES

Making the transition to university life is not always easy nor is it the same experience for every student. Students face a variety of challenges which may affect their personal growth, emotional well-being, and their ability to succeed. Some of these challenges include, but are not limited to:

- + Test anxiety
- + Issues with alcohol or drug abuse
- + Depression, grief or trauma
- + Relationship difficulties
- + Concentration problems.

Any of these issues may prevent students from reaching their full potential. Students may find that their previous methods of handling problems are not working for some reason. They may find, for example, that talking to friends or relatives about their concerns does not seem particularly helpful. Counseling is an educational process that students are encouraged to pursue, as needed or desired.

Counseling is a confidential process. Students are encouraged to speak freely and trust that their personal information will remain private. In the rare case that the Personal Counselor must speak with a student's family member(s) or the Dean of Student Services, the student will be notified.

HEALTH SERVICES

AUD Health Center provides general care medical care for all currently enrolled students, faculty, and staff, to promote the prevention of illness and the well-being of members of AUD community.

Minor cases are treated on the premises; however, students may be referred to health providers in the area for more serious problems that exceed the Health Center's capabilities. Blood testing for residence visas is scheduled through the AUD Health Center. This service is offered only for people sponsored by the university. The Health Center also provides health education programs for the university community on a regular basis.

All enrolled students are required to submit the Health History Form, which must be endorsed by a physician. Failing to provide the health form will place students on registration hold for the subsequent semester.

Students with medical problems or disabilities must submit a medical report from their physician, describing their conditions, restrictions, and special requirements, in order to receive academic help and/ or accommodations based on their medical needs.



MEDICAL INSURANCE

Private health insurance, covering care in the UAE, is mandatory for all AUD students. To enroll in the AUD-sponsored health insurance plan, students are charged a nonrefundable fee on their Fall semester bill covering the period of September 1st through August 31st.

For this fee to be waived, students are required to provide the Finance office with evidence of currently valid private health insurance, covering care in the UAE (Original Insurance Card). The deadline is the last day of the Fall semester Drop/Add (see AUD Academic Calendar).

Failure to provide this evidence before the deadline will result in cancellation of the option to waive the health insurance coverage and associated fee.

Students must collect their Insurance Cards from the Finance Department one week after drop/add period.

- Undergraduates with > 60 credit hours are encouraged to consult with their faculty advisors for assistance on degree requirements;
- ⁺ Engineering and Pre-Engineering students are advised through the Academic Advising Division until their graduation.

There is a set process for Readmission after Academic Exclusion. It is not automatic readmission; all students who have been academically excluded even for one term must reapply.

REGISTRAR



SERVICES

- + Maintaining student academic information;
- + Conducting and managing the process of registration;
- Monitoring and reporting on student satisfactory academic progress and academic eligibility such as degree completion, probations and suspensions, honor roll and graduation roll;
- + Coordinating and issuing official enrollment and academic certifications as required by the students, such as proof of enrollment letters, ID cards, transcripts and diplomas;
- + Posting of transfer credits for new and in-school transfers;

- Engineering students are advised at the Academic Advising Division throughout their residency at AUD.
- + Registration will be ONLINE ONLY, during the assigned registration periods.
- + Drop and add will be ONLINE ONLY.



HIGHLIGHTS

Drop/Add

Students may make schedule changes without penalty during each semester's Drop/Add period which is the first week of each semester. Drop/Add is not allowed outside this period.

Course Loads

Regular course load for full-time students:

- Undergraduate students: 15 credits during normal semesters and 9 credits during summer terms.
- Graduate students: 6 credits during normal semesters and 3 credits during summer I term.

Overloads are permitted only for student in good academic standing (GPA>2); and occasionally a higher CGPA may be required.

AUD's Advising Policy

Following their admission into AUD, all undergraduate students must meet with academic advisors prior to the start of each semester to learn about university policies and departmental requirements.



POLICIES

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY & HONOR CODE

All AUD students are expected to demonstrate the highest level of academic integrity in the University. Students are NOT to:

- + Submit work from another party or source
- + Submit papers without proper citation
- + Submit the same paper to multiple courses
- + Plagiarize by knowingly or intentionally claiming other people's work as their own
- + Cheat on exams
- + Allow or help other students to cheat
- + Obtain an exam paper from an instructor's office without his/her knowledge
- + Do another person's assignment



HONOR CODE

As a student of The American University in Dubai, I pledge that all tests taken by me and that all work submitted by me will be original and solely the results of my own efforts.

Furthermore, as a student and member of the academic community of The American University in Dubai, I am bound to uphold standards of personal integrity and honesty and to accept my personal, academic and professional responsibilities in the community.

Specifically, I pledge:

- + to adhere to the university's policy on cheating and plagiarism;
- + not to lie or steal in my university undertakings;
- + not to evade the truth or deceive;
- + to inform the appropriate faculty member and Dean, Associate Dean or Chair of my School or Department of any and all cases of academic dishonesty and violations of the Honor Code

Failure to abide by the University Academic Honor Code can lead to a failing grade on the assignment, in the course, in all semester courses, and in some cases can lead to dismissal from the University.

A student will, in most cases, appear before the University Honor Council. The Council has the responsibility of assessing the degree of violation and assigning the relevant punishment.

STUDENT DRESS CODE











The American University in Dubai, in accordance with the laws of the UAE, adheres to specific guidelines regarding appropriate attire. As a result, students are expected to respect themselves and others by dressing properly while on campus. Inappropriate attire will not be tolerated and violations are subject to disciplinary action.

Inappropriate attire is defined as, but not limited to:

- + Tight or revealing clothing;
- + Short shorts and micro-skirts;
- + Cleavage-baring tops or dresses;
- + Sagging jeans or jeans with suggestive holes or markings;
- + T-shirts with inappropriate logos or language;
- + Midriff-baring, open-back or halter tops.

Those responsible for the enforcement of the Dress Code Policy are: the Security Supervisor and security staff, and the Office of Student Services. If students, faculty or staff determine that a student is in violation of the Dress Code Policy, they may report the information to the Office of Student Services.

A four-step system is in place for dealing with students who violate the Dress Code Policy.

- 1. Students who are deemed to be in violation of the Dress Code will be stopped by security staff. At that time, students must present their student ID for verification purposes, and must report immediately to the Office of Student Services. Students who refuse or fail to present their ID to security staff and report to the Office of Student Services will be subject to disciplinary action including removal from campus and refusal to re-enter until all requirements are met.
- 2. The Dean of Student Services or designated Student Services staff will notify the student of the violation while reinforcing the Dress Code Policy. Students may be required to leave campus at any time as deemed appropriate by the Office of Student Services. Students will not be eligible to return to campus until he or she is wearing appropriate attire.
- 3. First-time violators name(s), ID number and date of violation will be entered into the Dress Code Database Management System.
- Repeat violators will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Violations of Conduct.

SMOKING POLICY

SMOKE-FREE CAMPUS PROCEDURE FOR VIOLATION OF POLICY

To maintain the Smoke-Free Campus Policy, designated smoking areas on campus have been set up as follows:

- + Behind the School of Architecture, Art and Design building
- + Behind the School of Business Administration building
- + Beside the School of Engineering building, tent area

A three step system is in place for AUD Students, Faculty and Staff members caught smoking outside these designated areas.



AUD STUDENTS

- First time violators: the student's AUD ID card will be confiscated. The student will need to register with the Security Supervisor and can collect the ID card one week after the incident.
- Second time violators: should the student be caught violating the policy again, he or she will be put on Registration Hold for the subsequent semester.
 To remove the Hold, the student must visit either the Health Center Director or the Student Support Manager in order to register.
- 3. Third time violators: a third violation will lead to the President and Dean of Student Services meeting to discuss giving the student a written warning or putting the student on probation.



AUD STAFF AND FACULTY

- First and second time violators: the employee will receive a written warning from the Human Resources Office.
- Third time violators: a third violation will be factored into the employee's annual performance evaluation.
